The Orange-tip butterfly is a striking and easily recognizable butterfly, known for the vivid orange patches on the forewings of the males. Females lack the orange coloring, instead having mottled gr...

Classification: Invertebrate

Family: Pieridae

Habitat: Meadows, hedgerows, and woodland edges

Diet: Herbivore

Conservation status: Least Concern

Lifespan: Up to 1 year (most of it as pupa/caterpillar; adult lives 3-4 weeks)

Weight: 0.03–0.05 g

Scientific name: *Anthocharis cardamines*

- The Orange-tip's eggs are laid singly on flower buds, as the caterpillars will often eat any siblings they encounter!
- Male Orange-tips are among the first butterflies seen in spring, often spotted fluttering rapidly along hedgerows. Their green mottled underwings pro...
